What are the advantages of blended learning?

- A physical class lecture is only accessible to those who can be present at a specific time and location, whereas a virtual lecture has no such limitations.
- Recording a lecture can help reach learners who cannot attend at a specific time.
- Can incorporate online and offline sessions to enhance the reach of the course.
- Can increase the chances of fulfilling course outcomes compared with fully online or offline courses.
- The integration of physical and virtual live e-learning environments enables students to test immediately their learning in future work contexts and to collaborate with their peers.
- Can increase students' confidence and motivation by providing a variety of resources, thereby decreasing the dropout rate.
- Can use online materials and encourage active participation from students in the classroom to create a deeper understanding of the topics.
- Provide activities beyond the classroom to improve interactions between teachers and students.
